#### Additional salient points from the tree trimming class:

- Never trim more than 25% of the foliage at one time
- Mature trees should not need any pruning
- A mature tree that suddenly gets sun after lot clearing will sort itself out. It will not remain 'hairy'. No need to trim.
- Leaves and decaying trees are the best fertilizer [expand your mulch beds around your trees]. Dried manure is the best choice for a tree if it is not doing well.
- It is the photosynthesis process that produces the sugar that is the trees lifeblood. 80% of the photosynthesis occurs in the upper canopy leave it alone.
- Do not prune when leaves are forming or falling [right now would be ok] Rake those leaves around the base and leave them as mulch.
- Live Oaks and Hollies drop their leaves and form leaves in the spring.
